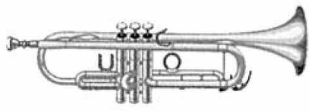

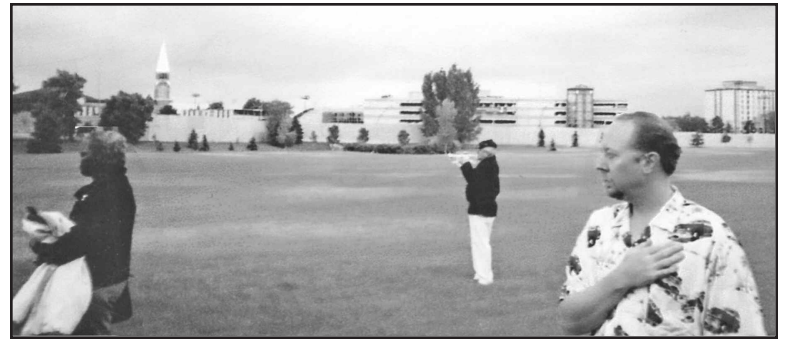

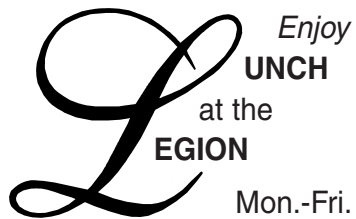
much say it all.

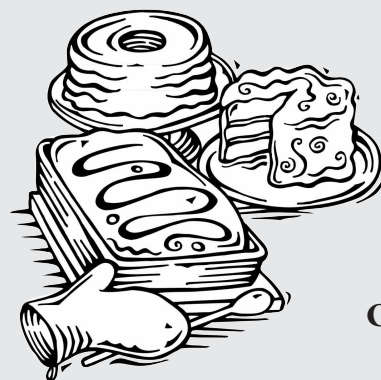

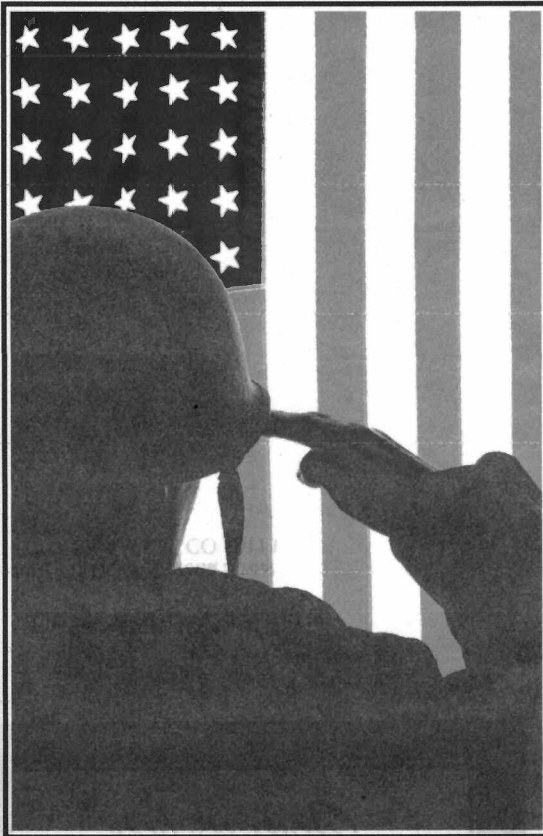
