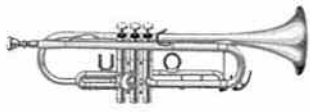

Let's Go To C.A.M.P.P.

It is that time of our American Legion year again — July 1 we began asking everyone to renew and pay their 2012 dues. Let's all be Early Birds and pay our dues by the end of August. To give everyone a choice in paying their yearly dues, We, **The American Legion, State Of Colorado**, are first again in the Nation to help our members.

Our new program is the **Department Of Colorado Advanced Membership Payment Plan (C.A.M.P.P.)**. (The program will be administered through the Department.) Lock-in your Dues and Eliminate Annual Dues Notices. Just make one payment now and enjoy the convenience of not paying your dues each year. C.A.M.P.P. will process your dues each year and send you your new card. It is easy; just tell your Post you want to sign up under C.A.M.P.P. or just call Department and tell them you want to be a member of C.A.M.P.P. (We are trying to get as many of the new C.A.M.P.P. application forms out to the Posts as quickly as we can.) You can pay by check or use your credit card.

C.A.M.P.P. is a simple and convenient method of paying your dues in advance to lock-in your current dues rate and avoid receiving those annoying annual dues notices in the mail. To join C.A.M.P.P. all you need to do is pay your annual dues in advance for three, five, or 10 years. It's that simple. When you join C.A.M.P.P. the cost of your dues is guaranteed for the term you choose. You don't have to worry about your Post dues increasing while you are with C.A.M.P.P.

Each year in July C.A.M.P.P. will automatically pay your dues for the following year to National, Department, and your Post, and send you your current Membership card. **You will never be delinquent, and even**

better you will not receive dues notices in the mail.

Current Legion members can join C.A.M.P.P. by paying dues for three, five, or 10 years in advance, along with a small 10 percent administrative fee. For example, if your Post dues are \$35 and you want to join C.A.M.P.P. for five years, your cost is \$35 times five plus 10 percent administrative fee. So for only \$192.50 your dues are paid and you are protected from any dues increase for five years.

A SPECIAL NOTE FOR ALL MEMBERS:

National has sent out their first 2012 Renewal Notices. You will find a notice about a new program started by National "Now Available, Renew Online." This is not mandatory. If you choose to use it, your dues will go to National. National will notify the Department that they have received Online Dues for year 2012 from State, Post, and Name. The Department will then notify the Post giving them the ID number and name of the person who renewed online through National. At this time the Post will issue the member his new card. Until you receive your new card from your Post you can use the temporary card you can print out from the Web site. When National sends the money they collected to the Department, the Department will forward the proper amount of dues to the Post or credit the Post account for that amount.

Remodeling of the old UPI Building, now called the Clinic Building South, has started.

The new hospital construction started in July. Plans are to open the new facility in August 2014.

There will be a new clinic built in Colorado Springs at Fontanero Street and Spruce. The new clinic will open in 2013 or 2014.

The VA recommends getting prescriptions by mail although prescriptions can still be picked up at the pharmacy.

The VA has an Ambulatory Sur-

gery program with the Air Force Academy. The program will provide orthopedic and general surgeries.

Decreasing minor surgeries at the main VA Hospital allows for more major surgeries.

Cataract surgeries are now being done at the VA.

The clothing room needs warm hats, scarves, boots, and winter clothes. Some other needs include sunscreen, lip balm, baseball caps, and water bottles.

Volunteers are always needed. The VA Hospital is one of the best and your support is appreciated.

Family Says Company Holding Late Veteran's Belongings

Investigative Reporter, KDVR ARVADA, CO — 69-year-old Thomas Jesik was a Vietnam Veteran, honored with two Purple Hearts. After his service, he became an Arvada firefighter.

But he battled war-related health issues most of his life. He finally lost the fight on Saturday, July 16. "He was my friend, someone to look up to," his son Chris Jesik said.

That's why what "Two Men with Big Hearts Moving and Storage" is refusing to do seems heartless to Thomas' family. "It is something we want to get for Dad. It was one of his last requests."

Chris Jesik and his wife Laura asked the owner of the Denver moving company to release Thomas' bunker gear, war patches, and his fire department plaque. They wanted to use the items for his funeral.

But the owner, Don Kennedy, refused to give them the items unless they paid \$600. Kennedy said he has had Thomas Jesik's belongings for five years, and he owed the company thousands of dollars.

Chris Jesik told FOX31 Denver he realizes his dad owed the company money. He says the medical bills devastated his family financially and they couldn't always afford to pay the \$500 a month storage fee. Still, Chris thought he might be able to convince the company to have a heart, like his sign says, "I understand he owed them money."

"We just want the bunker gear, the patches, and the plaque for the

FOX 31 Viewers Send Donations To Aid Family

A Vietnam veteran's war memorabilia and Arvada Fire Department gear has been released from a Denver moving and storage company, thanks to donations from viewers of FOX 31 Denver.

After our story aired, we received an overwhelming response from more than 100 viewers who wanted to donate their own money to get Jesik's memorabilia released.

The owner of the moving and storage, Don Kennedy, says he was also inundated by angry phone calls.

"Well, the veterans weren't real happy with me," he said.

FOX31 Denver established a bank account for donations on Thomas Jesik's behalf, and Kennedy agreed to release the memorabilia once the donations started coming in.

Veterans and volunteers came to his facility to help the Jesiks find what they were looking for.

Thomas' son Chris Jesik dug through several boxes before he pulled out his dad's fire gear, along with the plaque.

And while he didn't find the war patches, Chris Jesik and his wife says what they have is enough to lay a soldier and a father to rest — in peace.

"Knowing that we have these items at his funeral means everything to us," Laura Jesik said.

The owner of the moving and storage company would not release the rest of Thomas Jesik's belongings because he claims he is still owed thousands of dollars.

funeral; they aren't worth anything to the moving company. We could just borrow them for a few days and bring them back."

Kennedy told FOX31 Denver he feels his \$600 offer was generous. He said it would cost him more money in manpower to find their items. "It's going to take hours to dig that stuff out," he said. But he

did knock down his \$600 offer to \$500 while we were there. Thomas' son and daughter-in-law offered to do the digging themselves, but Kennedy won't budge.

Still, Chris and Laura Jesik are hoping the owner of "Two Men with Big Hearts" will have a change of heart in time for the funeral. It is scheduled for Tuesday, July 26.


