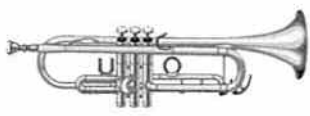

## Recruit + Retain

In the past several months I have been reviewing several articles that have value as to the past plus the paths that The American Legion has taken from 1919 to the present; much of this most of you may know.

The first National Convention was held in Phoenix, AZ, in September 1919. Most of the states with delegates in attendance submitted charters to become Post #1 of their respective states. At that time Four Pillars were established:

1. Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation
2. National Security
3. Americanism
4. Children and Youth

These pillars encompass programs that benefit our Veterans, service members, and their families, as well as the youth of America.

These programs make a difference in thousands of lives every year. The men and women who take time to perform them allow The American Legion to make a difference on every level of our country. Our motto "For God and Country" was taken very seriously by our organizational founders, and so should we.

My responsibility as Membership Chairman is to make certain that we recruit new members and retain our current ones. ## A Lesson That Should Be Taught In All Schools, And Colleges...

Back in September 2005, on the first day of school, Martha Cothren, a Social Studies teacher at Robinson High School in Little Rock, Arkansas, did something not to be forgotten. On the first day of school, with the permission of the school superintendent, the principal, and the building supervisor, she removed all of the desks out of her classroom.

When the first period kids entered the room, they discovered that there were no desks.

"Ms. Cothren, where're our desks?"

She replied, "You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn the right to sit at a desk."

They thought, "Well, maybe it's our grades."

"No," she said.

"Maybe it's our behavior."

She told them, "No, it's not even your behavior."

And so, they came and went, the first period, second period, third period. Still no desks in the classroom.

By early afternoon, news crews had started gathering in Ms. Cothren's classroom to report about this crazy teacher who had taken all of the desks out of her room.

The final period of the day came, and as the puzzled students found seats on the floor of the deskless classroom, Martha Cothren said,

"Throughout the day no one has been able to tell me just what he/she has done to earn the right to sit at the desks that are ordinarily found in this classroom. Now I am going to tell you."

At this point, Martha Cothren went over to the door of her classroom and opened it.

Twenty-seven (27) U.S. Veterans, all in uniforms, walked into the classroom, each one carrying a school desk. The Vets began placing the school desks in rows, and then they would walk over and stand alongside the wall. By the time the last soldier had set the final desk in place, those kids started to understand, perhaps for the first time in their lives, just how the right to sit at those desks had been earned.

Martha said, "You didn't earn the right to sit at these desks. These heroes did it for you. They placed the desks here for you. Now, it's up to you to sit in them. It is your responsibility to learn, to be good students, to be good citizens. They paid the price so that you could have the freedom to get an education. Don't ever forget it."

By the way, this is a true story. And the teacher was awarded Teacher of the Year for the state of Arkansas in 2006.

## Legion Finances

I am very pleased to become a more active Post #1 member as your Finance Officer. I am fortunate to have a very experienced and proficient bookkeeper, Cindy Keefe, who has been diligent in updating our financial system and ensuring that all taxes and bills are current and accurate. In addition, I am also quite fortunate in having a talented and enthusiastic Finance Committee, including Jerry Osgood, Bob Williams, Dan Minehale, Dave Powers, and non-voting Commander Glen Stenson.

My first challenge has been to address the operating loss the Post has experienced over the last two years. Although the amount of losses has not threatened the survival of the Post

at this point, it needs to be addressed now to prevent major problems in the future. The Finance Committee has been reviewing numerous issues to prevent future critical losses, including expenses, pricing, and increasing revenues by increased involvement in the activities of the Post. The Committee believes that a broad, balanced approach will accomplish our mission without excessive changes in any particular area.

One change approved by the House Committee on November 10, 2011, has been an increase in the price of bar drinks by \$0.25 across the board on January 1, 2012, to cover price increases to the Post. This change was also confirmed by the Executive Board on November 17, 2011. The House Committee also approved a more detailed look at particular drink prices where high costs are not in line with prices.

The Finance Committee is also working on a number of other tasks including the first operating budget in years and an operating manual that ensures all tasks are completed in a timely manner, as well as providing continuity when changes in Officers and employees occur.

Both the Finance Committee and I welcome your comments and suggestions to help us to achieve our mission.

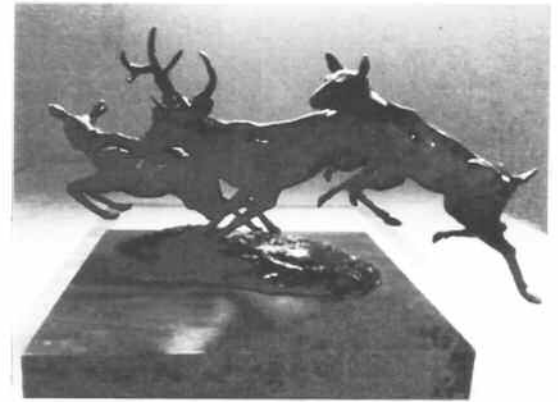
