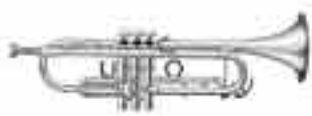

We Stand For America

The American Legion has been asked what we intend to do about the protests currently conducted by several professional football players who "take a knee" during the playing of the national anthem.

Commander Jay Bowen wrote a

letter to the President of the Denver Broncos, Joe Ellis, expressing concern about a Bronco player taking such action. Jay's point to President Ellis was that the player in question was an employee of the Broncos organization. As an employee, he should be expected to follow the standards of his employer. When a player wears the team uniform and is at work on the team's grounds, they represent the opinion and attitude of the entire team. Jay's question to President Ellis was, "What is your position on an employee expressing a personal opinion to disrespect the Flag and our National Anthem while on duty?"

Jay got a very polite letter back from the PR department of the Broncos essentially explaining that they are great supporters of community activities and they are strong supporters of the military and police.

They did not offer any rebuttal on Jay's assertion that kneeling was a "slap in the face" of those who wore, and wear, the uniforms of our country. Those who use our symbols to express a personal opinion about their perceived injustices are misdirected, uninformed and just plain

ignorant of the value of our Flag and Anthem.

So instead of protesting the protest, Commander Bowen decided to take the high road and tell the world who we are.

We are The American Legion.

We are proud supporters of our military, our first responders, our communities, our families and our nation.

We believe in the Constitution of the United States.

We believe in the right to peacefully assemble, the right to speak our opinion, the right to bear arms.

The Forgotten Heroes Campaign

The Forgotten Heroes Campaign, founded in 1998, helps men and women who served in the armed forces receive the medals they earned but never received. To date the Campaign has helped over 500 men and women and their families receive the recognition long overdue. After verification, the medals are presented in a special ceremony, usually held here at LCW Post 1.

The Campaign provides the Veteran with the correct forms and conducts research to validate the request. If necessary, the Campaign uses contacts in Congress to expedite the process. The Campaign knows there are many Veterans who have incorrect information on their discharges.

The Campaign is a 501(c)3 non-profit. Funds are needed to pay for the awards when the DOD does not do so. A benefit golf tournament for The Forgotten Heroes Campaign will be held Sunday June 25, 2017, at The Links Golf Course in Highlands Ranch. The \$135 per player fee includes green fee, cart, range balls, continental breakfast, lunch and prizes. Registration deadline is June 16, 2017, and there is a registration form on the Post 1 bulletin board. For further information contact Barry Fiore at 303-507-6034.
